Ride Description: This is a lovely flat to rolling ride through historic sections of Wethersfield, Rocky Hill and South Glastonbury. It features a trip through Goodwin Park and a special side trip into beautiful Cedar Hill Cemetery, which is an historic arboretum and the final resting place of Katharine Hepburn. There is a double crossing of the Connecticut River on the Rocky Hill – Glastonbury Ferry (\$2.00 round trip fare), and a short section of hard packed stone dust trail to enjoy (OK for road bikes).
