The ride also visits Duchess County in New York for about 10 miles and features some great riding on several county roads w/ low automobile traffic. While the early portion of the ride is hilly (especially the very difficult Skiff Mt. Road climb early in the ride), the last half of the ride is over mostly flat terrain.
